

Literacy

Students will be writing a recount of the story of Rosa Parks, this links with their History Topic American Civil Rights. Students will also be writing the essay titled: "Civil disobedience was more important than legal decisions during the civil rights movement."

Art & DT

In Art students will be using the stippling technique to create collages of famous activists from the American Civil Rights movement.

Humanities

History: Over six lessons, pupils will have learnt all about the civil rights movement in the USA during the 1950s and 1960s.

Languages

Students will continue to follow the KS2 Scheme of Work for Spanish.

Computing

Students will be looking at coding. This will include programming, debugging and writing different codes. They will be able to explain how to program and change programs that have already been made

Term 1

Music

Students will be participating in keyboard lessons, concentrating on rhythm and learning how to play "Beethoven". As well as this students will be participating in class singing practice.

Maths

Students will be converting units of time, reading timetables and solving problems that involve time. Students will also be interpreting data in a variety of different ways using graphs and charts.

Science

Students will be looking at all living things: plants and animals. They will be studying all aspects of the animal kingdom, and how animals are related. They will also be classifying living things.

RE

Students will be studying Buddhism: Places of worship & Rituals: Vihara and its features; The 8 holy rituals; symbols including the lotus flower, wheel, Bodhi leaf and a footstep; meditation and chanting

PE

Students will be taught skills in gymnastics that will be complex and well executed sequences. With/ full range of movement/variation and good kinaesthetic awareness
